We want to thank you for your prayers AND financial help in growing STR to 12 stations and 1 TV station is just ten years!

In order to reach all of Michigan, Strong Tower Radio is adding vital members to our team. We hired retired pastor George Dronen, a certified public accountant, and committed layman Kam Ferguson as fundraisers to coordinate growing our stations financiallyand physically, as well as helping to sustain STR. With this added staff the ministry will have a larger presence in local churches. Pastors can begin scheduling a STR speaker by emailing

As opportunities present themselves, other responsibilities will be to work with donors that want to rapidly provide radio stations across Michigan. There are some really awesome opportunities just about to break and STR will be ready for them with this new development department.

George Dronen, our new development director was born and grew up in the 1930s on a farm in McVille, North Dakota. He was in the United States Navy in the 50s, specializing in radio communication. He then worked for the Great Northern Railroad in the early 60s. He and his wife, Barbara, were baptized June 13, 1964. In 1965, he began his service as a gospel worker

HOW MUCH MORE

ur Camp Meeting theme this year comes from Luke 11:13 where Jesus, in a series of lessons on prayer, declares, "If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!"

What an incredible promise! Notice the unmistakable work and fruit of this gift when it is received into our hearts as outlined in the book *The Desire of Ages*.

"When the Spirit of God takes possession of the heart,

- 1. it transforms the life.
- 2. Sinful thoughts are put away,
- 3. evil deeds are renounced;
- 4. love, humility, and peace take the place of anger, envy, and strife.
- 5. Joy takes the place of sadness, and
- 6. the countenance reflects the light of heaven.

No one sees the hand that lifts the burden, or beholds the light descend from the courts above. The blessing comes when by faith the soul surrenders itself to God.

7. Then that power which no human eye can see creates a new being in the image of God."²

It is no wonder why the enemy of souls wants to keep us from genuinely asking, seeking and knocking for the gift that our heavenly Father longs to give. In fact, the pen of inspiration reveals to us that, "There is nothing that Satan fears so much as that the people of God shall clear the way by removing

every hindrance, so that the Lord can pour out His Spirit upon a languishing church and an impenitent congregation. If Satan had his way, there would never be another awakening, great or small, to the end of time."³

Satan will do whatever is possible in his power to prevent the way being opened for God to "grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man, that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height— to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

The devil trembles at the thought of the Holy Spirit working in us. If he had his way, he would forever hinder us from seeking for it, praying for it, and believing for it. He wants to keep us endlessly bound by the sinful thoughts, evil deeds, anger, envy, strife and sadness mentioned above. He bends his efforts to bewitch us with a love for the things of this world—the entertainment, fashion, sports, and all the like that captivate our interest and monopolize our time from a desire for the things of heaven.

The apostle Peter, understanding the devil's desire to hinder the Holy Spirit from being poured out in great power, earnestly entreats, "Beloved, I beg you as sojourners and pilgrims, abstain

from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul."5 "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour. Resist him, steadfast in the faith."6

Praise be to God that because of Jesus and His Holy Word, "we are not ignorant of his devices. It is possible to resist his power." May we believe His Word that as we "submit to God" and "resist the devil", he will flee from us. And as we "draw near to God...He will draw near" to us.8

Looking unto Jesus and in His strength, let us remove every hindrance to the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Paul writes to the Corinthian believers: "Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God."9 Let us pray that the Spirit of God would impress with great force upon our hearts to "not love the world or the things in the world."10 Because as the apostle John warns, "If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in Him. For all that is in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—is not of the Father but is of the world. And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever."11

Dear friends, do we believe with all our heart that Jesus is coming again soon? Do we believe the prophetic word that great changes are soon to take place in our world that will usher in the time of trouble and bring every soul to the test? If we do believe, let us then pray with longing desire for the Holy Spirit to open our eyes to see more of Jesus and His beautiful character. Let us pray for the Holy Spirit to teach us the joy and gladness of feasting upon the holy things of the world to come. Let us give our all to God for the cause of Christ and the honor of His name.

As we think about this year's upcoming camp meeting, may we remember that it is often in the assembly of the saints, as the people of God seek Him with their whole heart, that the Lord pours out His Spirit in extraordinary ways. God has used such occasions in the past to bring about amazing and wonderful revivals.





HOW DO YOU SIGN THAT?

hat would you do if someone wanted help understanding the Bible but you did not speak their language?

I had a few sign language lessons with Vivian throughout the previous two weeks. Even though I was only in Laos for a few weeks visiting friends, she was excited that I was interested in learning how to communicate with her. It was an interesting learning experience because there was not one common language between the two of us. Google Translate was a big help. Sometimes she would search an English word and look at images to try to understand the word. It usually worked, but when she searched 'melt' it showed a grilled cheese sandwich and I was trying to explain that there is a lot of water when the snow melts in Michigan in the spring. When she searched 'gross,' we just laughed at those images. Even though repetition, clarification, and Google were necessary, we had some good conversations; sometimes talking for three hours at a time.

To me, most of the conversations seemed like small talk. Since I was

only in Laos for a short time, I didn't know what the long term benefit of our interaction would be. When would I ever need to know Lao Sign Language again? Nevertheless I continued the lessons and the conversations anyway.

One night, during our last three hour conversation, we moved from her apartment into my friends' apartment. My friends weren't home but Vivian and I sat on the couch and continued talking. She started looking through the books on the shelf and saw a Bible. She asked if this was really Jesus' book. She repeated that question a couple times and then started reading it. As she flipped through and ended up in Revelation, I secretly hoped she wouldn't ask about the three angels' messages because I did not know how I would explain that through sign language. She eventually turned to Revelation 13:16-17 about the mark of the beast and stopped. She told me that people in America are already being implanted with microchips in their wrists. We searched the news and confirmed it. I then sat and stared at the text, not wanting the conversation to end there but wondering what to say through so many language barriers. I said a quick prayer and told her that the devil hates those who believe in Jesus and he wants to control what they do (mark on the hand) and what they believe (mark on the forehead). She added that he wants to kill those who believe in Jesus. I agreed. She asked me if I wanted the mark. I told her no, but that I believe in Jesus. She said, "Me too." I was okay with the conversation ending there and thanked God for giving me a way to explain that passage that she understood.

Our language lesson continued as a friend of hers came into the house and started looking through the bookshelf as well. She picked up a book with a cover picture of the holes in Jesus's hands and explained, also through sign language, how the story of Jesus made her cry. I told her that she could read the book but she didn't know English. I found a couple tracts in her language and gave those to her. As she read, Vivian and I continued talking. Before the girls left, I noticed that the friend was reading The Desire of Ages. I didn't know how much she understood since the book was in English, so that night I asked members of the local church for a copy of the book in the local language. They were able to give me several copies of Steps to Christ and I gave one to both Vivian and her friend. They excitedly accepted the books. I don't know when I will need to use Lao Sign Language again, but I know why I had to learn it then. Please pray that these girls read the books and develop a closer walk with God.

as pines and spruces and long, harsh winters. These long, harsh winters do not faze the snowshoe hare, however. These creatures are very well equipped for the snow.

As their name indicates, they have relatively large hind feet that enable them to run in the snow without sinking. They also have fur on the soles of their feet to keep them from freezing in the cold temperatures during the winter months.

Along with "snowshoes", the snowshoe hare has another trick up its sleeve that helps it to survive the winter. When

spending time with Him daily, we become more like Him and the "color" of lives begin to change. In 2 Corinthians 3:18 (NIV) it says, "And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit."
